Server Training

Nebraska currently does not regulate server training, nor does the state provide a training program for licensees.

Recommended Age for Carding

ID Confiscation

Nebraska does not prohibit licensees from confiscating false IDs. Licensees may also use a documentary proof of age book.

Policies Regarding Minors

It is unlawful to serve or sell alcohol to anyone under the age of 21. There are no state laws regarding minors in establishments that serve alcohol, but there can be local ordinances or policies set by the establishments.

Non-Alcoholic Beer and Wine

Nebraska regulates non-alcohol beer and wine the same as it does alcohol beverages.

Alcohol Liability

Following is a list of penalties for first offenses in violation of certain liquor control laws. Sanctions may be more or less:

- Sale to a minor - up to \$1,000 fine or 10-day license suspension;
- Sale after hours - up to \$1,000 fine or 10-day license suspension;
- Sale to intoxicated person - up to \$1,000 fine or 10-day license suspension;
- Purchase of alcohol from other than a wholesaler - up to \$1,000 fine or 10-day license suspension.
