Server Training

Oklahoma currently does not regulate server training.

ID Confiscation

Licensees may hold identification until authorities are notified and ID is turned in.

Policies Regarding Minors

It is unlawful to serve or sell alcohol to anyone under the age of 21. Minors are not allowed to consume alcohol in the presence of their parents or legal guardians under any circumstances, either on or off a licensed premise. In establishments where sales from food account for more than 50% of total sales, minors are allowed in the establishment but not in the designated bar area. Minors are not permitted in establishments whose food sales are less than 50%. Minors are not permitted in retail stores for any reason at any time.

Non-Alcoholic Beer and Wine

Not regulated.

Liquor Liability

It is considered a felony for a licensee to serve or sell alcohol to a minor or someone who is visibly intoxicated. The penalty for a first offense can be a fine of up to \$2,500 and one year in jail. Other violations vary from a \$150 fine with a three-day suspension of license to license revocation.
