



Techniques for Effective Alcohol Management

State information: Alaska

General Regulations

Legal age to Consume Alcohol: 21
Legal age to Serve Alcohol: 21
Limit for Driving While Intoxicated: .08
Dram Shop Liability Laws: Yes

Server Training

All servers of alcoholic beverages, their supervisors and persons providing security in licensed businesses must receive approved alcohol server training within thirty days of employment. Each server, supervisor or security person must renew their server training certification every three years.

Acceptable Forms of ID

Any Valid State Driver's License
Military ID
Valid Passport
Valid State ID card with photo and birth date
Valid Tribal ID

If an alcohol server has reason to believe that the identification card presented is fraudulent, the licensee, agent, or employee shall refuse entrance to a licensed premises and shall refuse service to that person, per 3 AAC 304.425(b).

Recommended Age for Carding

Anyone who appears to be underage

ID Confiscation

Yes, licensees may confiscate false ID's and must turn the confiscated ID's over to law enforcement as soon as possible.

Policies Regarding Minors

It is unlawful to serve or sell alcohol to anyone under the age of 21.

Non-Alcoholic Beer and Wine

Not regulated.

Liquor Liability

AS 04.16.030 specifically prohibits the sale of alcoholic beverages to drunken persons, or even to allow a drunken person to enter and remain within a licensed premises or to consume an alcoholic beverage within a licensed premises.
