Policies Regarding Minors

It is unlawful to serve or sell alcohol to anyone under the age of 21. No one under the age of 18 years is permitted on a bar premises at any time (even during private events), unless the person under the age of 18 years is a musician performing in a band on the premises under written contract with the permittee for a specified period and is under the direct supervision of his/her parent or guardian during such time.

Non-Alcoholic Beer and Wine

These beverages are not regulated by Louisiana Alcohol & Tobacco Control.

Liquor Liability

Selling alcohol to minors: maximum penalties included revocation or suspension of alcohol license or server permit

1st offense: \$500 fine 2nd offense: \$1,000 fine 3rd offense: \$2,500 fine
