## **Server Training**

Montana currently requires approved server/seller training.

## **Recommended Age for Carding**

None

# **Policies Regarding Minors**

It is unlawful to serve or sell alcohol to anyone under the age of 21. State laws do not prohibit admittance of underage persons to establishments.

### **ID Confiscation**

Licensees should confiscate fake IDs and turn them over to law enforcement

### Non-Alcoholic Beer and Wine

Beverages with 0.5% ABV or less may be purchased by minors. These beverages are not regulated by the Department of Revenue.

### **Liquor Liability**

Selling alcohol to minors:

1st offense: \$500 fine, up to 6 months in jail for server;

\$250 administrative fine for licensee

2<sup>nd</sup> offense: \$1,000 fine, up to 6 months in jail for server;

\$1,000 administrative fine for licensee

3<sup>rd</sup> offense: \$1,500 administrative fine. up to 20-day license suspension for licensee

4th offense: license revoked

Selling alcohol to an intoxicated person:

1st offense: \$500 fine, up to 6 months in jail
