32 ounces of malt beverages per container 4 ounces of spirits per container No more than 2 containers to any 1 individual at one time

Vermont currently requires approved server/seller training.

#### **ID Confiscation**

Only law enforcement officers are authorized to confiscate false IDs

# **Acceptable Forms of ID**

Valid photo driver license Liquor control adult ID card Valid passport or U.S. passport card US military ID Valid photo non-driver ID card

### **Policies Regarding Minors**

It is unlawful to serve or sell alcohol to anyone under the age of 21. No regulations prohibiting minors from being in a licensed establishment, but they may not drink alcohol.

#### Non-Alcoholic Beer and Wine

These beverages are not regulated by Vermont Department of Liquor & Lottery.

#### Liquor Liability

\$500 to \$2000 fine and/or imprisonment up to 2 years for serving or selling to a minor. Suspension or revocation of license determined by Liquor Control Board. It can also be a felony if minor injuries self or another due to intoxication.
